If the provider or program of instruction of your choosing is not available to you at the time you wish to enroll, you may wait until it is open again or consider another program of instruction or another provider of training. Your case manager can advise you on this.

Note 1. This school and its programs are a USDOL Registered Apprenticeship Program. In addition there are other programs of instruction not listed here that are available through an apprenticeship and which will result in employment while in a learning status with OS2U. Please discuss these with a Case Manager.

Many of these programs have an on-line distance education component. For these programs, you must have a home computer that is compatible with the school's website and training modules, a high speed internet connection, and be able to devote the required time to work at home. These programs require personal discipline and family support to work independently without distraction during study and computer time. Contact the school for further information.

All programs are either degree or certificate. Degree programs are usually an Associate. Certificate programs are generally 1 year in length and offer core skills without degree requirements. Most offer the skills required to receive a credential or certification.

There are out-of-area schools not included on this list that offer the same training programs. We can consider them under certain circumstances, however, the cost for schools not on the list may be greater and require you to travel some distance. There are also other requirements that must be met and staff can advise you of these. We generally do not pay costs at schools outside our area that are higher than local schools. Travel and living expenses are generally not covered by us.
