


Workforce Solutions of Central Texas focuses on the tools Central Texans need to get a job, keep a job, or find a better job.

SKILLS TRAINING

The Accelerated Skills Attainment Program (ASAP) is used for short-term training of fewer than 16 weeks that results in an industry-recognized certification. For example, Baylor Scott and White is working with WSCT staff and Temple College to train Certified Medical Assistants to meet their business requirement and patient needs. Funding can cover training including tuition, books, fees, testing costs, and work-related expenses. *ASAP* started at the beginning of 2022. Data is not fully available.

The National Dislocated Worker Grant (NDW) provides workforce training services at Fort Cavazos and in the seven counties surrounding the installation to trasitioning service members and their spouses. The grant assists in dislocated members of the armed forces & their spouses.
